Notice of Finding of No Significant Impact

For the Alpine Domestic Water Improvement District
San Francisco River Waterline Repair Project

The Water Infrastructure Finance Authority of Arizona (WIFA) has received a request for technical assistance from the Alpine Domestic Water Improvement District for a Drinking Water infrastructure project. The purpose of this notice is to inform the public and request comments.

WIFA staff analysis concluded that the following project neither individually nor cumulatively has a significant effect on the human environment. Therefore, the following project qualifies for a Finding of No Significant Impact (FONSI) under the National Environmental Policy Act.

The Alpine Domestic Water Improvement District proposes to design approximately 1,300 feet of new waterline which would follow the eastern side of US 191 then cross under US 191 and intersect an existing line at the intersection of CR 2062 and CR 2077. The proposed project would involve boring under the San Francisco River for approximately 100 feet and under US 191 for approximately 70 feet.
